Methods. Those who think philosophically through colors. For example, they learned information such as a person's position and religious affiliation from the color of a turban. Even today, color plays a significant role in the development of fine arts and occupies a special place in human life. After all, colors can have a positive and effective impact on a person's mood and psychology. In addition, it not only theoretically and practically teaches young people how to accurately depict the sizes of surrounding objects, but also their structural structure, proportions, laws of perspective, color, color range of paints in nature, contrast, and serves to educate aesthetic taste. In fine arts, aesthetic concepts are expressed in such forms as beauty, aesthetic experience, imagery, and symbolism. D.Karshiboeva is a graphic Member of the Union of Artists. Many of his works are done in graphic and color, and he creates in his own philosophical style. If we analyze his work "Philosophy of Life", we will see that the composition is written in a graphic style, and through its black and white lines we will witness a masterful depiction of the good and evil of life, its tireless efforts and hardships.
